Program Opportunities

Learning on the Land (by application)

Learning on the Land is a 5-credit cross-curricular course offered in the second semester of the school year. The program focuses on outdoor learning experiences as opposed to learning in the classroom. Throughout the course, students will experience activities such as canoeing, camping, hiking, fishing, plant identification, water and soil sampling, and much more. The five credits that will be obtained are Wellness 10, Native Studies 10, Wildlife and Habitat Studies 10, Environmental Science 20, and ELA 10.

Personalized Sports Training (by application)

Students in grades 10-12 have the opportunity to further develop their physical capacity through our personalized sports training program. The program is open to all high school students and is based out of Peacock Collegiate. Students can improve their skills in a particular sport, receive personalized training from a certified fitness coach, and earn credits while doing it.

Dual Credit

Dual credit programs are Ministry-approved programs that allow high school students to take post-secondary courses and/or well-defined programs offered by other entities. Dual Credits provide alternative pathways to graduation by allowing high school students the opportunity to earn high school credits, and post-secondary credits or other program recognition concurrently in the same course.

Volunteerism Credit

A Volunteerism credit is offered to students for community service activities that may take place in a variety of settings, including businesses, not-for-profit organizations, public sector institutions (including hospitals and long-term care facilities), and informal settings.

Apprenticeship Credits

Students employed under the supervision of a journey person in a job which the hours worked are eligible for apprenticeship time credit through the Saskatchewan Apprenticeship and Trade Certification Commission may earn up to four secondary level Apprenticeship Credits on the basis of work proposed and completed by the student. Apprenticeship A20, B20, A30, and B30 may be used to fulfill the requirements for graduation, and to meet the PAA/Arts Education credit requirements. Only students who are enrolled in a secondary school in Saskatchewan and are employed in a trade are eligible for Apprenticeship Credits.

Special Project Credits

Special projects are student-initiated and designed to encourage the pursuit of learning in an area of personal interest or passion. The content of the special project(s) need not be related to a specific school subject.

Course Challenge

Course Challenges recognizes that some students are able to demonstrate a high level of achievement of the learning outcomes of a particular course without spending the required hours enrolled in the course. A maximum of two course challenge credits may be attained at the 10 or 20 level. A mark of 80% or higher is required to receive credit recognition.

Program Opportunities cont'd

Career and Work Exploration (CWEX)

Career and Work Exploration is to promote career planning and decision making through work-based learning complemented by classroom learning. The areas of focus for the Career and Work Exploration 10, 20, A30, B30 curriculum are the three stages of the career development continuum: awareness, exploration, and experiential. As students progress from one level to the next, the amount of time spent in work-based learning increases while the amount of time spent in classroom learning decreases.



Think Opportunity ...Think Snapshots

This programming provides core safety orientations online at no charge. To complete Career Safety Education, three safety courses must be completed. The two mandatory courses are:

- Young Worker's Readiness Certificate Course (YWRCC)
- Workplace Hazardous Materials Information System (WHMIS)

Depending on your career interests, you can choose one of the following orientations:

- Agriculture: OATS (Online Agriculture Training System)
- Heavy Construction: RSTS (Roadbuilders Safety Training System Online)
- Construction and Trades: SCOT (Saskatchewan Construction Orientation Training)
- Healthcare: WAVE (Workplace Assessment and Violence Education)
- Energy: EGSO (Electronic General Safety Orientation)

GRADE 9 PROGRAM

Our family motto is *Education Through Teamwork*. Students are grouped with specialized middle years teachers to help lead them through the transition to high school. This family atmosphere provides students with a small, safe environment in which they can build close relationships with teachers and other students. Parents are an integral part of our team, and we keep in close contact to ensure a positive experience for students.

The core classes of English language arts, math, social studies, and science are taught in the morning while a wide range of electives are offered in the afternoon. Teachers will adapt, as necessary, to help students achieve success in their course work. All family teachers are available for extra help and students are encouraged to take advantage of this. With being the oldest standing public high school in the province, we are steeped in a tradition of excellence in academics, athletics, and the arts. Central Collegiate offers French Immersion for those wanting to earn their bilingual certificate in French achieving 12 of 24 credits in French. Our French immersion team collaborates with the division French Immersion team as well as with the French community to engage students in collective activities and events.

Central also offers Advanced Placement (AP) classes. AP is for students who excel and wish to further enrich their experience in certain subject areas. This program is currently offered in Calculus, Art and Biology. We also support dual credits when offered from local universities. These courses carry the potential to earn a university or college credit prior to leaving high school.

Students requiring additional support, enrichment, modification, English as an Additional Language support, or individualized programming will find the help to meet their needs. Our Student Support team works with ALL students to ensure that academic needs are being met, and ALL students achieve personal success.

DIVERSE COMMUNITY

Our cultural diversity contributes to the richness and strength of our school. At Central, we have a strong EAL (English as an Additional Language) Program with teachers from diverse backgrounds. All EAL students are supported throughout their English language acquisition journey as programming needs are individualized for each student to match their level of language competency. Our EAL students work on locally developed curricula to support their progress with the CFR Level (English competency level) in four strands of language: speaking, listening, reading, and writing.

At Central Collegiate, with over 35 spoken languages, we believe that diversity is our strength. The importance of inclusive diversity can sometimes be taken for granted, but there is no doubt that we are all better, stronger, and more successful because of it.

Did you know we run on the block system . . .

Riverview offers a block system with 2 classes a day. Here are advantages of the block system:

Deeper Focus on Fewer Subjects

- **Fewer Classes at a Time:** students typically take 3-4 classes per term instead of 6-8, allowing them to focus more deeply on each subject.
- **Longer Class Periods:** extended periods (often 75-90 minutes) provide time for in-depth discussions, hands-on activities, and project-based learning.

Reduced Stress

- **Manageable Workload:** with fewer subjects at a time, students have less to juggle, which can alleviate stress and improve mental health.
- **More Time for Assignments:** longer class periods often include time for starting assignments in class, giving students a head start and reducing homework load.

Improved Teacher-Student Interaction

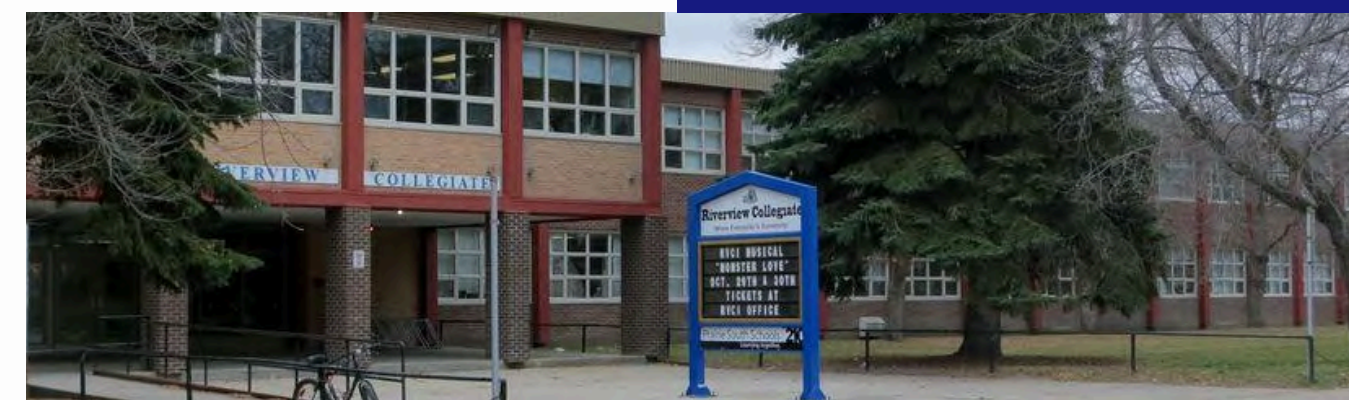
- **Strong Relationships:** spending more time with the same teacher each day fosters strong connections and better communication.
- **Individualized Attention:** teachers can dedicate more time to addressing individual student needs during extended periods.

Enhanced Learning Opportunities

- **In-Depth Projects:** longer classes allow time for labs, projects, and creative activities that would be rushed in shorter periods.
- **Better Retention:** concentrating on a smaller number of subjects over a shorter term may improve retention compared to spreading courses over a longer semester.

Flexibility

- **Credit Recovering or Acceleration:** students can complete courses more quickly and, if necessary, retake a class within the same year without falling behind.
- **Variety of Offerings:** more courses offered throughout the year, giving students a wider array of electives and opportunities.



GRADE 9 PROGRAM

A smooth transition from Grade 8 is one of the main objectives of Riverview's Grade 9 program. By offering students a smaller and welcoming learning community, Riverview creates a sense of belonging that connects students to each other, to the faculty, and to their learning. This encourages Grade 9 students to be positive contributors to the school culture.

Grade 9 students obtain the compulsory courses to meet core curriculum requirements. Students are able to choose elective courses from the Practical and Applied Arts and Performing Arts classes that Riverview offers.

The Grade 9 class at Riverview has a dedicated Student Support Teacher that team teaches with the grade 9 teacher during core classes to help support students in their academic transition to high school.
